We acknowledge Penobscot Theatre Company's presence on the unceded ancestral lands of the Penobscot people. The land from which we benefit continues to be a place of foremost importance to the Penobscot Nation and all descendants of the Wabanaki Confederacy. We recognize that the Wabanaki people continue to seek resolution on issues concerning water, territorial rights, and threats to sacred sites.

The Penobscots have inhabited Maine and the surrounding areas for over 11,000 years. Their ancestral territory included many rivers that flow into the Gulf of Maine, including all the watersheds from the Machias River in the east to Cape Ann in Massachusetts. The Penobscot Nation is one of the oldest, continuously operating governments in the world. The Penobscot Nation is part of the Wabanaki Confederacy, which also includes the Passamaquoddy, Micmac and Maliseet.

PTC resolves to be an anti-racist institution. We are proud to be members of the Wabanaki Alliance Coalition and are committed to living our values by promoting the history and cultures of the Wabanaki Peoples and sustaining an ongoing relationship which supports the art, resources, and values of indigenous peoples and tribes.







A Letter from Jen Shepard, Artistic Director

Hello and Welcome to PTC's 52nd Season,

I'm PTC's new Artistic Director but I've been here for a bit. In 2004, I moved to Maine and opened ImprovAcadia which was a professional seasonal improv comedy cabaret. At the end of our first season, I was thrilled to discover that Bangor had a professional regional theater. I went to school for theater and have been an actor since I was 16 so having a professional theater so close to home was a delight.

The first show I saw at PTC was Rebecca Gilman's Spinning into Butter. I was so impressed with the production, the building, the staff, the talent, the whole thing, really. I wanted to get involved but I wasn't able to. The demands of my own small business, ImprovAcadia, and my winter work with The Second City kept me from auditioning but not from attending shows. I continued to attend shows and fostered the hope that one day I would work at PTC. In 2014, we stopped leaving every winter to work for Second City and I auditioned. I was so excited but I didn't get the part but that's an actor's life. I didn't give up and the next season, I landed two plays: It's a Wonderful Life and Hair Frenzy. That began my continuing relationship with PTC's staff, artists, and patrons. I found rewarding work, a community of artists, and a passionate and engaged audience.

In July 2020, Bari Newport brought me onboard as her Interim Executive Director and in 2021 I was offered the position full time. Hed PTC with her, then with Acting Artistic Director Tricia A. Hobbs, and most recently, with Jonathan Berry. When Jonathan announced his departure, I knew that I wanted to step into the role of AD. I have always loved this company and this community. I know that for many folks PTC is their first and most frequent theatre experience. Everyday I see kids come for Dramatic Academy classes, or a student matinee, folks new to town or maybe longtime Mainers come for their first play drawn in by a beloved classic or a new play about Maine and they find more than that. They find a shared experience that is filled with human emotion and connection. They may only come one time but many visit again and again.

Right now, I believe that our audiences need joy, love, heart, and laughter. What better to give to a world that is hurting and angry than love, joy, and laughter? A moment of respite and solace in a world that feels rough and fractured can give one the strength to go on, to offer joy and caring to another human, or to themselves. I have lived my life in the world of comedy as well as the world of drama. There is no joy without sadness and the deepest most cathartic laughter comes from human connection. Laughter disrupts the darkness and fosters hope and community.

I hope to bring you joy, laughter, tears, and back to laughter again.

A Note from the Playwright Jeffrey Hatcher

TURN OF THE SCREW is one of the most unsettling ghost stories because it's about children. The notions of death and possession are always troubling, but add children, in this case two children, a boy and a girl, and as James puts it, you've added "a turn of the screw."

When I wrote this adaptation nearly 30 years ago, I was a huge fan of Henry James' novella and a devotee of one of its screen adaptations, Jack Clayton's THE INNOCENTS (1961) starring Deborah Kerr. And, as an adaptor, when you think the source material is perfect and a previous cinematic adaptation is perfect, you have to wonder what you can add to the party. Fortunately, I had been asked to write a dramatic adaptation for the theater, and there I did think I could bring something different to the story, at least in the way that it's told.

It's very tricky to depict ghosts on stage. There's the Disney Haunted House version. There is also the actors wearing grey or white makeup version and similar variations which always come across as hokey. And so in this adaptation, my goal was to eliminate the "spook house" aspect and use the stage's ability to suggest character, time and space theatrically rather than try to depict these elements realistically. Because after all, how does one realistically depict a ghost? Should a ghost be made of flesh and blood or is it see-through? Is a ghost an oral or a visual experience? Or both? Is a ghost a memory that won't go away? A hallucination that lives as much behind the eyes as in front of them? Theater allows you to suggest all these things at once, without one idea contradicting another, like a double or triple exposure.

I hope this production of TURN OF THE SCREW unnerves and unsettles you - in all the right ways. And I hope when you leave and try to make sense of what you've seen, you experience a satisfying level of uncertainty.






